Description: A large circle of granite and marble with the shape of Texas in it. Ringed by plaques with the names and accomplishments of African-American West Texans. There are sixty markers.

History: The memorial is dedicated to those who have participated in the progress of the African-American community in Lubbock. It is both a tribute to those past and present and is intended to be a “living” memorial. It was placed in close proximity of the “Wall of Inspiration” and the “Sandlot Player,” and all three pieces help to strengthen the community in the Dunbar-Manhattan Heights neighborhood.
